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Pre-Development Programme (Ireland)

Suit Ur selfie is a predevelopment Training Programme for Vulnerable young people designed to enabled and support them to positively engage in further education or training opportunities.

Target Group:

Young People with Junior Certificate/equivalent or less and little or no work experience. Some of these young people could will also face additional barriers such as literacy/numeracy, substance misuse and/or criminal records.

All young people will be aged between 16 and 24 years of age and priority will be giving to young people living in the Rapid areas of Mullingar who have been out of education or training for the past 6 months or been unable to secure a place on other activation/ training programmes due to not meeting the educational level required.

Capacity, Duration and Location:

The course will cater for 12-14 young people, commencing the first week of February for a 17-week period. The course will take place from 9.30 am -2pm Monday to Thursday inclusive. The majority of the course will be facilitated in a local community youth center, for practical reasons some modules may need to be facilitated of site.

Rational:

Particular groups of young people need particular responses. These responses need to be tailored to their needs and a 'one size fits all' approach is not always the most effective. The Irish Youth Guarantee has provided much needed training, education and employment opportunities for young people under the age of 25 years, but the difficulty of engaging young people who are most vulnerable and most distant from the labour market remains a challenge.

Increased pressure to participate in certain activation measures that may not always be suitable for such young people, at least without appropriate adaptation needs to be carefully proofed against unintended negative consequences for the young people in question. These young people usually have left school early, with limited or no formal educational credentials, low self-efficacy and poor literacy skills and by the time they come into contact with Employment Service at the age of 18 their educational disadvantage has often been compounded by other negative experiences and their problems have become even more intractable. Most do not have the confidence to present for interview and some cannot comprehend the correspondence they receive regarding upcoming opportunities so they remain a very long way from being 'job ready'.

Suit Ur Selfie will take a youth work approach that is above all young people centred and tailored to meet the needs and circumstances of the individual, rather than process-driven, through using a holistic approach that aims to empower young people to make the most of their existing strengths. Through providing a wide variety of taster modules accredited and non-accredited all participants will be able to identify with something of interest and build on it. Continuous Individual learning/Care plans will be developed and help identify specific issues for each young person, if the need for additional intervention is identified the worker will support the young person or act in an advocacy role in gaining access or support to other relevant agency or organisation.

Community Employment Programme

CE or Community Employment is a programme of work and training for people who have been out of work for a while. Jobcare's CE programme gives participants the skills needed to get back into the workforce and break the cycle of being unemployed.

The barriers to stable employment can be many and common: loss of confidence from redundancy, mental illness, addiction, a criminal record, teenage pregnancy, generational unemployment at home, literacy gaps and other personal difficulties. Unaddressed, these issues can bring about a life of dependency, low self-esteem and the despair that accompanies long-term unemployment.

Jobcare provides a caring and supportive environment that encourages individuals to recognize these barriers and supports them as they take practical measures to bring about positive change for themselves and their families. At the same time we provide for our CE participants a structured framework within which they can learn the disciplines and satisfaction of work.

AM I ELIGIBLE?

Community Employment is 19.5 hours per week and is sponsored by DSP. Participants are given on-the-job training, opportunities for certified vocational training, and coaching and mentoring towards their chosen career goal. Enquire with your local Intreo case officer re. eligibility.
