There are many ways to get experience or even a full-time job in Europe. We made a list for you with some useful platforms that could be the one thing you need!

EVS (the European Voluntary Service) It helps young people with ages between 18 and 30 to travel abroad to participate in volunteering projects, which can involve many different kinds of activities in areas such as youth work, cultural activities, social care or environmental protection. During your voluntary you will get accommodation, pocket money and reimbursement for costs of travel.

The duration could be from 2 weeks to 12 months. What you have achieved and learned through volunteering is certified Europe - wide via the Youth pass recognition tool.

EURES - is a cooperation network designed to facilitate the free movement of workers within the EU 28 countries plus Switzerland, Iceland, Lichtenstein and Norway. The purpose of EURES is to provide information advice and recruitment/placement/job matching services for the benefit from the principle of the free movement of persons.

Job shadow - It's great idea if you want to learn how other employers work in the field that you interested. It involves working with another employee who might have a different job in hand, might have something to teach, or can help the person shadowing him or her to learn how aspects related to the job, organization, certain behaviours or competences.

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Internships. You can go abroad to work at a company for a fixed and limited period of time. Internships are mainly for students and graduates. The positions may be paid or not and are usually temporary. You can use the internship to determine if you have an interest in a particular career to create a network of contacts or even get a chance to get a job in that company.

AIESEC is a global collaborative youth driven network which believes in practical learning and ethical everyday leadership. They activate leadership qualities in youth through learning from practical experiences in challenges environments. Aiesec facilitates cross culture exchanges in the form of volunteering experiences and professional internships.

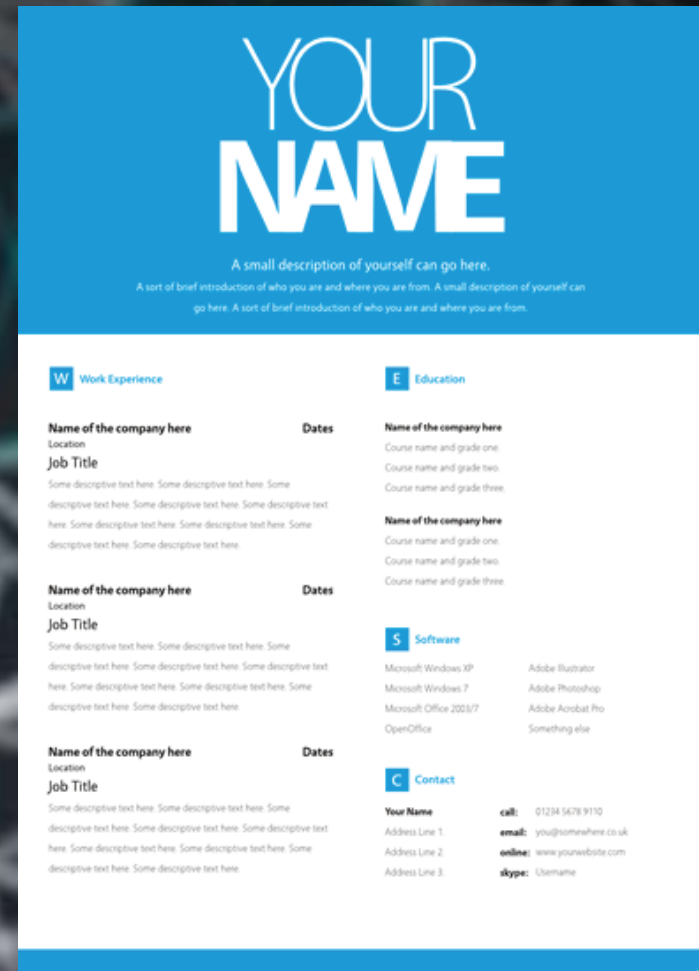
A curriculum vitae is a detailed record of your career and education and it can be unlimited. You have to organize your CV with sections: education, professional, experience, publication. What to include depends on what the position entails.

DO'S

- use professional languages
- be clear and short
- put on the top your strongness
- highlight relevant information on the first page of the CV to get the attention of the employer
- use power words such as: manager, co-ordinated, motivated, supervised, achieved etc.

DONT'S

- don't make grammatical mistakes
- never humiliate yourself, also try to not show off
- be careful with papers, stains are always making bad impression
- don't copy from sample CV's on internet (try to be original)
