4. The Prince Of Monaco



the couple decided to divorce and a war in media began. Diana died in a car crash while she was trying to avoid the paparazzi in Paris with her then lover.


TRADITIONS TODAY

European Union even today faces different types of equality issues, one of the being equality of both genders. In today's EU member countries, as well as different world countries, there is a problem when it comes to equal pay related questions, where women are earning significantly lesser than their male colleagues. So, what are the objectives that allow this kind of inequality to still exist in today's modern world?

Since the 1990's there has been a significant increase in number of employed women in part-time jobs, which also has affected their duties concerning housework and parenthood, in parallel, based on statistics, much more women are graduating from universities than men, but are still considered as less qualified. One of the main causes that affect women's image in society is a mind-set, that is filled with stereotypes of both genders, that simply effect the ways men and women are seen and see themselves and their duties.

According to 2015 statistics, women's hourly earnings were on average 16.3% lesser than men within the European Union. Gender pay gap is affected by a list of different reasons, one of them being a choice women make in favour of part-time jobs rather than full-time, hence the need to contribute as a parent and decisions made in favour of family, the decisions most men are not expected to make. The balance between two genders differ in workplaces and countries, the reason behind it being different attitudes towards role of women in society.

One of the most talked about moments concerning the European Union events in 2017, has been a remark made by Polish EU Parliament member Janusz Korwin-Mikke, who stated: "Of course women must earn less than men because they are weaker, they are smaller, they are less intelligent. They must earn less, that's

all." The statement and Korwin-Mikke received a negative backlash in the media and fellow female members of European Parliament stated that women should be protected from comments and attitude of such nature.

There has been set four levers that could change a perspective of role of both genders in everyday life:

1. Need for a flexible and affordable childcare;
2. Shared responsibilities during parenthood and everyday housework; enabling men to take paternity leave without facing criticism, or introducing childbirth leave;
3. Promotion of diversity in workplaces and companies, also addition of quotas within company's chair members and state's government;
4. Bringing change to education system, in order to eliminate gender based standards and stereotypes.

In order for a future change, today's generations must understand the importance of appreciation of another based on their qualities rather than assumptions about gender. The pay in the workplace must be based on quality of work and a potential of a worker, rather than the persons gender.

Individuals are the part of society with all these similarities and differences. Therefore, it gets a meaning as completed.


Not accepting a friend request of a black, not giving a job to a woman or not renting a house to a person who is from different religious and similar executions obstacle to provide some people with their freedom.
