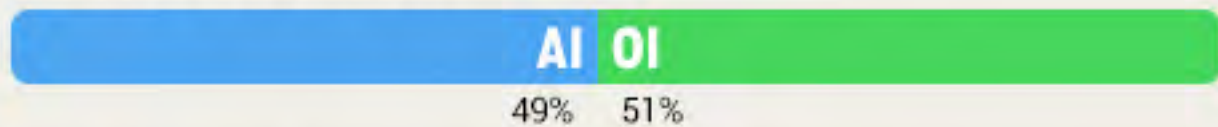

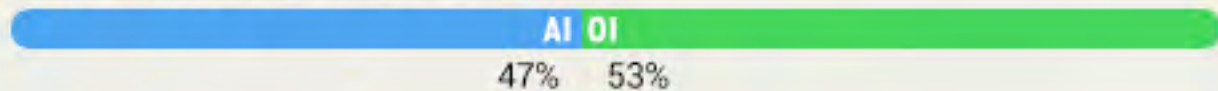

My name is Martin and I live in Slovakia. My country entered the European Union in 2004, the Schengen area in 2007 and the Eurozone in 2009. But what does entering into the EU structures really mean? Has the situation improved? What are the benefits?

FREE TRAVEL

This is considered as one of the biggest advantages of EU by many people. It is really amazing that you can travel freely throughout almost whole Europe without any border controls, just with your ID card. From my own experience I still remember the traffic congestion when leaving for a holiday abroad. But free travel does not include only road traffic, but also rail traffic, airports... This means hours and hours of saved time just because there is no need for any passport checks. There is also no need to pay the customs and duty for imported goods basically saving you money.

OPTIONS

European union bring plenty of different options for different people. For adults there is the enormous European labour market, where they can find a job in any of the 28 member-countries lot more easily than before. Students can also study at foreign universities more easily. Worth mentioning is also EVS and last but not least the ERASMUS+ project. This includes a whole bunch of opportunities, including ability to study for a semester or two at a university in a different country without further problems, but one of its parts are also Youth exchanges. These support meeting new people from different countries, but most importantly it teaches us to show our culture, respect other culture, respect other cultures and it shows us that even though we may be of a different race, nationality, gender, etc. we are all similar and even despite our differences there is no need for us to dislike or even hate each other. EU also offers many options to gain work experience, including the EVS, European Solidarity Corps, Erasmus+ for young entrepreneurs or the database for work opportunities EURES.

When transporting the products, all of them have to be inside a certain wrapping or package and therefore, as the cheapest opportunity, plastics are chosen and used for almost any package, not really being good for the environment.

Over all, I would conclude that even though some disadvantages, I think that entering the EU was one of the best things that could happen to my country. I got really used to life in the EU, and I think that leaving the EU today would be a huge step back into the past.
