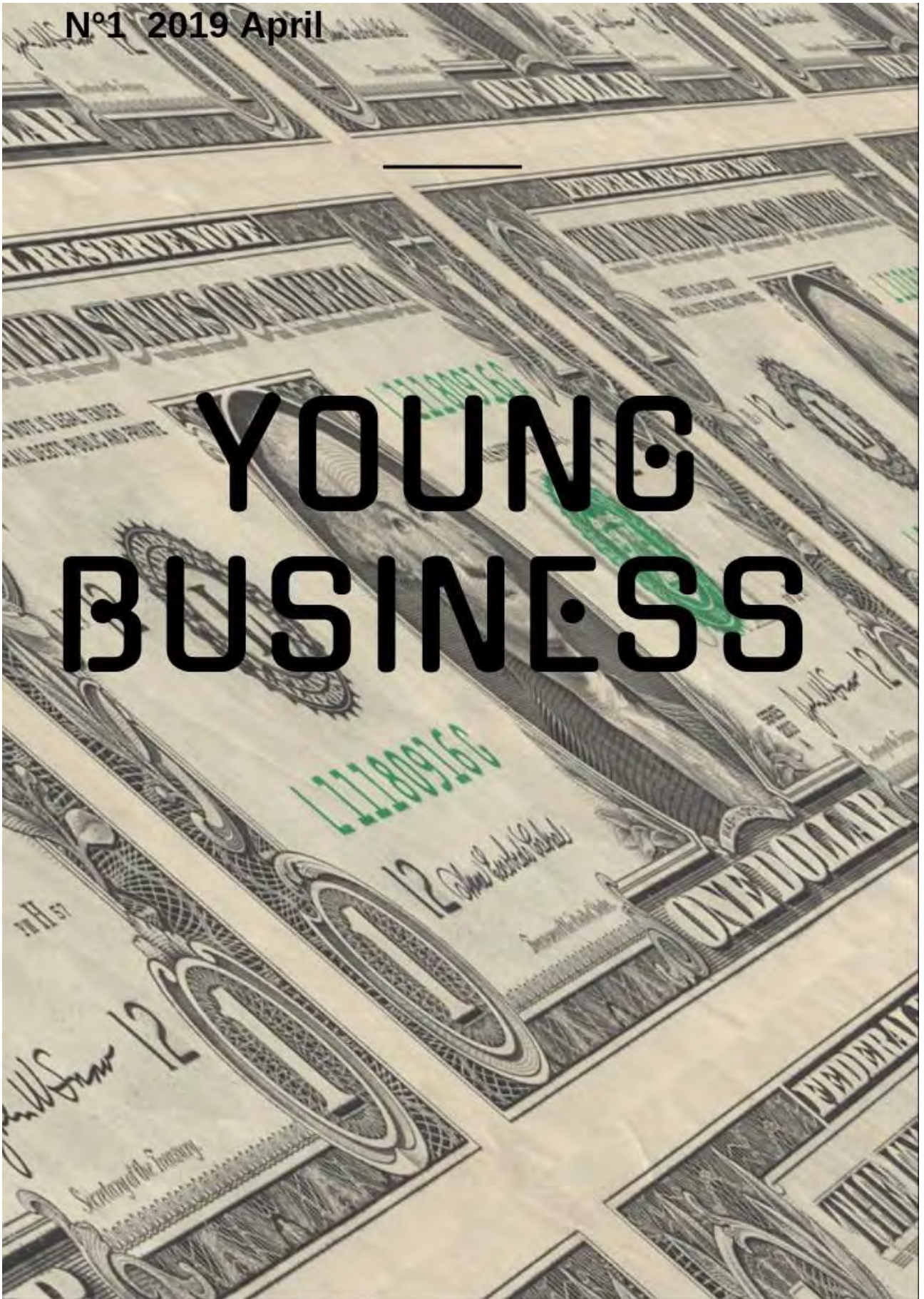

CREATING A JOB BASED ON MY SKILL AND COMPETENCE

The web master is the one who designs and takes care of the development of a website, adopting solutions that guarantee the necessary balance between the contents (articles, videos, photos) and the requirements of an aesthetic and technical nature.

What skills must a web master have?

Technical skills: must know the programming languages (html, css, php, javascript),

Skills in computer security (firewall knowledge),

SEO skills (Search Engine Optimization),

Team working with other professional figures (graphic designers),

Creativity and attention to detail,

Problem solving,

Punctuality and Organized,

How to listen and understand customer needs.



DO'S AND DONT'S ON CV

A necessity to start a successful business career is to build a good CV. Curriculum vitae is your "magic" card that it will lead to take a job.

- You have to keep it simple with no unnecessary stuff or many and bright colours. It's better to use black ink and use bullet points.
- You should place the important information up-front.
- Put experience and education achievements in reverse chronological order starting with your current job and working backwards.
- Put your name and email address on every page.
- Include experience and interest that might be of use to the employer like driving skills, voluntary work, foreign languages diploma.

Also some don't's that you don't want to include in your CV. First of all you shouldn't lie about your skills or any previous experiences. Employers have ways of checking what you put is true.

- Don't include referees, just state they are available on request.
- Don't include all of the jobs you have had since school just the relevant ones.



WORKING/OPENING A BUSINESS IN ANOTHER COUNTRY (DO'S AND DON'T'S – TIPS AND TRICKS)

- 1. Localize your idea, vision and expectation.**
Find a local mentor or investor who can help guide you to understand the culture and the local consumer.
- 2. Learn the language.**
Sometimes learning a language can feel almost as challenging as starting your business. You can meet up with someone that speaks the language fluently and work with them to none your skills. Even poor language skills are better than none.
- 3. Live like the local**
Be genuinely interested in the country and it's culture. Get out and meet your customer or participate in cultural experiences every day.
- 4. Study the competition, both past and present.**
Before entry a new market, every entrepreneur knows to research the competition. Study five companies that tried to enter that market and failed and learn from the mistakes
- 5. Build a new network**
You old network becomes less actionable when you move abroad, so you'll to build a new local one.

Don't you know what is Eures?

Eures (European employment services) is a cooperation network, formed by public services for employing and organizing employers, created in 1994 to facilitate the free movement of workers in European countries. Through its portal, about 1000 consultants help job seekers find work and employers to hire staff across Europe.

Eures offers many services, including:

- information on living and working conditions in the Member States (ex: taxation, health insurance),
- specific services for those workers who daily cross the border to go to work (ex: Italy-Slovenia),
- post recruitment information and assistance: how to integrate, language training,
- search for a job offer based on CV,
- Drop 'pin @ Eures: helping young people take their first steps into the world of work.

Suppose you are an employer looking a staff for your new business. To access the services that Eures offers free of charge, you have register on

the Eures portal. First, however, make sure you are based in one of the 28 countries or in Switzerland and have a VAT number.

Once the registration has been approved, you will be able to publish a job offer or access the CVs of the candidates present in the Eures database and choose the candidate who has the required skills. It will then be contacted by Eures.
